CALL TO ORDER – Ms. Boots

PLEDGE TO THE FLAG – Ms. Himes

MISSION STATEMENT – Ms. Caldwell

APPROVE AGENDA – Item “10b. Fee Structure” was removed from the agenda. Motion to approve the agenda by Ms. Caldwell, second by Ms. Sauerbeck. Approved by consensus.

APPROVE MINUTES OF THE MARCH MEETING – Motion to approve the March minutes by Ms. Caldwell, second by Ms. Jury. Approved by consensus.

SCHOOL INITIATIVE UPDATE

Interventions – Ms. Boots has met with English, math, and special needs teachers to talk about individual student interventions.

CONSENT AGENDA

Discipline Report – No written report was available due to problems with Infinite Campus. Mr. Franzen did report that the biggest behavior issue is class tardies.

Instructional Budget Update – Report was discussed.

Youth Services Center (YSC) Update – Both the March and April reports were presented. Linda Bates, YSC director, talked about the Reality Store and Health Fair.

COMMUNICATIONS

Good News – The written good news sheet was inadvertently left out of the Council packet. It will be mailed to members. A copy is attached.

Audience Comments – None.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Budget Committee – Debbie Morgan presented the Proposed Instructional Budget for next year. After discussion, Ms. Peters moved to accept the report as written, Ms. Crail seconded, and the motion was approved by consensus.

Governance Committee – Mr. Franzen asked Council to approve the following changes to the student agenda as recommended by the committee:

- ✓ **All** electronic devices will be prohibited between 7:25 and 2:15.
- ✓ **All** food and drink must be consumed in the cafeteria. No eating and/or drinking in hallways and classrooms.
- ✓ Coats and jackets must be put in lockers at the beginning of the day.
- ✓ **No** PDA – No kissing, no extended hugging.

After discussion, Ms. Caldwell moved to approve these changes, Ms. Hegyi seconded, and the motion was approved by consensus.

Technology Committee – Toni Schneller presented a report detailing this year's improvements in technology, as well as some areas of concern and possible solutions. Ms. Boots added that she had just ordered 4 new projectors, several document cameras, and a new 16 computer mobile lab.

### OLD BUSINESS

Policy #17 Second Reading – Mr. Bankemper moved to approve the second reading of Policy #17. Ms. Caldwell seconded. Motion approved by consensus. This policy will now be forwarded to Mr. Strong for his signature.

Project Graduation – The Project Grad will take place June 2 from midnight until 6 am at Town & Country in Wilder. Permission forms, parent volunteer forms, and donation forms are being mailed to senior parents. Cost will be \$20 per student. The district is sponsoring a Jeans Day to benefit Project Grad on May 15.

Scheduling Update – Ms. Boots and the administrative/guidance staff have begun scheduling for next year.

Testing Update – The theme for this year's CATS Madness is "Wild, Wild West."

### NEW BUSINESS

Youth Services Center Grant – Ms. Bates went over the YSC Grant for next year.

Parent Election Results – Parents elected to SBDM Council for next year are: Brenda Sauerbeck, Sandra Bryan, Chuck Heilman, and Dianne Perrin. Ms. Boots announced the names of teachers running for Council.

Allocations and Staffing – Ms. Boots gave Council handouts explaining the formulas used to determine staffing in all areas. She also handed out a table detailing how many student requests were received for each class, how many sections will be offered, and approximate class sizes. Ms. Caldwell moved to extend the meeting for ½ hour. Ms. Peters seconded. Motion approved by consensus. Council discussed this information for the next ½ hour. Ms. Caldwell moved to extend the meeting another ½ hour, Ms. Himes seconded, and the motion was approved by consensus. Finally, based on all of this information, Ms. Boots made recommendations for staffing for next year. After discussion, Council asked that the Board of Education revisit our staffing allocations. Council was concerned that the dual credit classes were not figured correctly in the staffing formula. Ms. Peters moved to approve Ms. Boots' staffing recommendations, Ms. Sauerbeck seconded, and the motion was approved by consensus.

Alternative Time Recommendation – Ms. Boots presented a recommendation from the Alternative Time Ad Hoc Committee. After some discussion, it was tabled until the May meeting to give faculty Council members time to discuss it with their departments.

Planning Day/Professional Development Plan for 2009-10 – Ms. Boots presented a plan for next year's Planning Days and Professional Development. After discussion, Ms. Jury moved to approve the plan, Ms. Caldwell seconded, and the motion was approved by consensus.
