APPROVE AGENDA – Ms. Bryan moved to approve the agenda as presented. Ms. Hegyi seconded. Motion approved by consensus.

APPROVE MINUTES OF JANUARY MEETING – Ms. Crail moved to approve the minutes of the January meeting as presented. Ms. Caldwell seconded. Motion approved by consensus.

SCHOOL INITIATIVE UPDATE

Interventions – Math and reading teachers, along with their collaborating special needs teachers, met with Ms. Boots and the staff developers to discuss MAP scores and what could be done to raise them. More students are being moved into the Voyager reading program.

CONSENT AGENDA

Discipline Report – Mr. Franzen was finally able to run a discipline report in Infinite Campus but it showed student and teacher names and, therefore, could not be presented to council.

Instructional Budget Update – Ms. Boots reports that spending has been frozen as far as is possible. Math textbooks are up for adoption for next year and we will probably only purchase math books for new courses.

Youth Services Center (YSC) Report – Ms. Huff and Ms. Bates from the YSC will be assisting Mr. Franzen and the Bank of Kentucky Center staff with coordinating our last Project Graduation. It will take place at the Bank of Kentucky Center at NKU. After this year we will begin sponsoring Project Prom.

NEW BUSINESS

Review Policy #17 – Standards and Assessments – The Assessment Committee will rewrite this policy and submit it to Council for approval.

Review Policy #18 – Algebra I for Incoming Freshmen – According to state law, students who take Algebra I in the eighth grade and who score proficient on our ninth grade Algebra I end-of-course assessment will be given credit toward graduation. Policy #18 will be reworded to indicate this change. With this change, Ms. Bryan moved to give this revised Policy #18 a first reading. Ms. Peters seconded. Motion approved by consensus.

Proposed Policy #22 – Parent Contact – Ms. Sauerbeck moved to give Policy #22 a first reading. Ms. Caldwell seconded. Motion approved by consensus.

Credit Recovery Coordinator and Assistant – Laurie Gray presented Council with job descriptions and pay rates for the Credit Recovery Coordinator and Assistant. Both positions are outside the regular school day and are funded through credit recovery funds. Ms. Caldwell moved to approve the job descriptions and pay rates. Ms. Sauerbeck seconded. Motion approved by consensus.

Summer School Update – Ms. Gray presented a proposal for summer school. After discussion, Ms. Crail moved to approve the proposal. Ms. Jury seconded. Motion approved by consensus.

Good News - February 24, 2009

The CCHS Academic team won their 11th consecutive district championship and then, for the 7th time in the last 10 years, they won the 9th region championship. The regional win was anchored by 1st place finishes by both the Future Problem Solving team (Lia Garafolo, Ryan Moran, Demi Michael, and Chanell Karr) and the Quick Recall team (Geoff Ritzmann, Taylor Duncan, Ryan Moran, Toby Hill and Chris Geiman).

The CCHS Robotics team (Ashley Hyden, Kyle Hunt, and Toby Hill and volunteer coach Nancy Eyerma) won the high school division of the regional RCX contest. They had a perfect score of 300 using only 1 minute and 41 seconds of the allotted 2 minutes 30 seconds. They will now compete at the state STLP contest on May 21 at Rupp Arena. This is the first time in 7 years of competitions that there has been a perfect score. The next highest score was 240.

Four more of our students were recognized by the Scholastic Writing Awards program. They are:

- Cody Strouse - Silver Key winner for short story
- Sarah Versluis - Silver Key winner for short story
- Morgan Woeste - Silver Key winner for journalism
- Tony Bankemper - Honorable Mention for short story

The speech team competed at the regional tournament and the following nine students advanced to the state competition in March: Megan Bergman, Courtney Combs, Taylor Duncan, Jordan Egan, Megan Gregory, Merideth Scott, Katie Sebastian, Ashley Stamper, and Makena Warner. At the Ky. Educational Speech and Drama Association's state tournament Ashley Stamper advanced to quarterfinals in prose and poetry and Tyler Gabbard advanced to semifinals in poetry, placing in the top 12.

The following students passed their Microsoft Office Specialist Certification Exam for Word:

After finishing second in the regional tournament, the wrestling team finished 4th at the state wrestling tournament. Seven out of ten wrestlers placed in the top eight in their weight classes:

- Caleb Schneider finished 4th
- Korey Shotwell finished 3rd
- Jake Lee and Jake Ilg finished 2nd
- State Champion - Dusty Brown

Katie Kitchen was named the LaRosa's MVP of the week on January 27th.

The competition squad cheerleaders placed first at NKU's competition.

The Lady Camels freshman basketball team finished second in the freshman Regional Tournament.

The Swim/Dive team finished 7th out of 24 teams in regional competition. Top finishers included:

- Olivia Schultz - 6th in diving
- Zak Koeninger, Ryan Hornback, Tyler Huff, and Justin Sand finished 5th and 6th in the 200 and 400 free relays.
- Samantha Styer, Ashley Loudermilk, Sarah West,Carolynn Dreyer, Heidi Schultz, Lydia Bear, and Erin Walch placed in the top 12 in the 200 and 400 free relays and the 200 medley relay.
- Olivia Schultz went on to place 9th in the state in diving. The boys 200 relay team came in 15th in the state.

Seventeen band members attended the Morehead Band Clinic. Five made it to the top level band.
