GOOD NEWS FOR JUNE 2009

The girls and boys track teams both won regional championships. This was the first regional championship for the girls and the first for the boys since 1995 (fourth overall). Twelve girls qualified for state in 13 of 18 events. Nine boys qualified in 10 out of 18 events. At the state meet, the girls brought home a state runner-up team trophy along with 3 individual state titles and 1 individual runner-up. The boys finished 13th overall, which was a huge improvement from 32nd place in 2008. The boys also had one individual state title.
