**APPROVE AGENDA** – Ms. Caldwell moved to approve the agenda. Ms. McCafferty seconded. Motion approved by consensus.

**APPROVE MINUTES OF LAST MEETING** – Minutes of the February meeting were presented and amended as follows: Under District/School Initiative Update – 20/10 – sentence should read “Focus meetings have been held with math, English, and special education teachers.” With this amendment, Ms. McCafferty moved to approve the minutes. **DISTRICT/SCHOOL INITIATIVE UPDATE**

**Literacy Update** – The latest round of PAS scores show improvements in reading.

**20/10** – PAS review meetings have been held with math and English teachers. Ms. McCafferty asked Ms. Boots to check if CCMS is reviewing PAS data and, if so, if that information (discussion of motivation vs. skill level) for 8<sup>th</sup> graders could be sent to us to help with scheduling.

**Building Positive Relationships** – Faculty council members asked if they could be sent an electronic copy of the latest newsletter.

## **CONSENT AGENDA**

**Budget Report** – Ms. Boots reported that the \$3500 per month that we spend for copiers is divided as follows: \$2000 for leasing and \$1500 for maintenance contracts. The monthly budget report was presented and discussed.

**Discipline Report** – The discipline report shows impressive drops in write-ups, especially among seniors.

**Youth Services Center Report** – No report.

**Alive at 25** – Alive at 25 is a four hour teenage driving safety course sponsored by the National Safety Council. Ms. Boots is looking into making this a requirement for obtaining a parking pass. Officer Armstrong may take the training to teach the course. If so, Ms. Boots may see if drug awareness can be incorporated into the course so that it could replace the film that we currently use for drug awareness education.

## **COMMUNICATIONS**

**Good News** – The FFA Senior Chapter Meeting team finished second in the Northern Kentucky region. The Junior Chapter Meeting team finished with a superior rating. Sarah Boden finished first in horse impromptu speech. Molly Slucher finished second in floral impromptu speech. Melissa Oerhle was elected Region 7 FCCLA Vice-President of STAR Events and Dana Foster was elected Region 7 FCCLA Vice-President of Community Service. The CCHS Academic Team won the 9<sup>th</sup> Region Governor's Cup for the 6<sup>th</sup> year in a row. Ryan Hayes won 1<sup>st</sup> place and Patrick Delaney placed 3<sup>rd</sup> in Composition. In written assessments Michael France placed 2<sup>nd</sup> in both math and science. Michael Detisch placed 2<sup>nd</sup> in social studies and 3<sup>rd</sup> in language arts. Bradley Hitch and Greg Morris placed 3<sup>rd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> in math, respectively. At the state competition, the team made it to the final 16. The Boys' Bowling team finished first place in the Regional Tournament. The Girls' team finished in the top 8. In the State Speech Tournament, Ashley Stamper advanced to semifinals in prose interpretation, and Megan Gregory and Chelsey Murray advanced to semifinals in improvisational duo. At the FBLA Regional Competition Erik Kloeker received 1<sup>st</sup> place in the Talent Show, Anna Stagner received 1<sup>st</sup> place in Word Processing, Wesley Williams received 1<sup>st</sup> place in Technology Concepts, Megan Bergman, Chanell Karr, and Ryan Moran received 2<sup>nd</sup> place in Entrepreneurship, Paige Oldendick received 2<sup>nd</sup> place in Smith Scholarship, Rachel Elkins received 3<sup>rd</sup> place in the Talent Show, and Ashley Geiman received 3<sup>rd</sup> place in Business Report as well as being named to Who's Who in FBLA. Ms. Pam Hamons was named Outstanding Adviser. Our vocational school students did very well at the Skills USA competition.

Results are posted in the marquee outside the main office. The Drama Department will present "Anything Goes" April 11-13. The boys basketball team were district runners-up. The girls team won the district.

Audience Comments – Meg Crail reported that the PTSA election for officers and SBDM representatives will be April 10. They are also sponsoring a laptop raffle. Tickets can be purchased in the media center. PTSA will provide a Faculty Appreciation luncheon for faculty and staff on May 9.
