APPROVE AGENDA – Mr. Bankemper moved to approve the agenda. Ms. Crail seconded. Motion approved by consensus.

APPROVE MINUTES OF APRIL MEETING – Add the following statement at the end of Allocations and Staffing under New Business: “Discussed allocation issue and asked the Board of Education to revisit.” With this addition, Ms. Caldwell moved to approve the April minutes. Ms. Hegyi seconded. Motion approved by consensus.

SCHOOL INITIATIVE UPDATE – Testing is going on now and is going well. Interventions are on hold until after testing.

OLD BUSINESS

Revisit Policies 18 & 22 – Policy 18 was returned from Central Office with some issues as follows:

Under Philosophy, #2 should read “The student scores proficient on a valid, reliable Algebra I end-of-course assessment.

Under High School Department Chair Responsibilities, #1 should read “Create a committee to create the CCHS Algebra I end-of-course assessment.

Ms. Bryan moved to approve these revisions to Policy 18. Ms. Sauerbeck seconded. Motion approved by consensus.

Ms. Hegyi moved to return Policy 22 to committee with a model from the state. Ms. Caldwell seconded. Motion approved by consensus.

Alternative Use of Time – Several council members reported that some of the faculty members were a bit apprehensive about the plan for Camel Learning Communities. However, after discussion, Mr. Bankemper moved to approve the plan and Ms. Himes seconded. Motion approved by consensus.

Allocations & Staffing – The Board of Education refigured the staffing formula for the high school and gave us back one allocation. Ms. Boots recommended that we hire another social studies teacher to relieve large class sizes in that department. Ms. Himes moved to accept the recommendation to hire another social studies teacher. Ms. Sauerbeck seconded. Motion approved by consensus. Stimulus money will allow us to retain our fourth guidance counselor and will allow us to hire a math intervention specialist. Because we are no longer losing a guidance counselor, Ms. Boots recommended that we revisit the Instructional Budget and use the \$26,000 allocated for a testing coordinator to hire a ½ time business teacher (we have three classes of business with no teacher) instead. Discussion ensued about whether to hire a business teacher or to pay Donn Manker to teach 2 calculus classes and another math class (Mr. Manker has agreed to teach the 2 AP Calculus classes for no-pay for next year). After discussion, Mr. Bankemper moved to approve Ms. Boots recommendation for a ½ day business teacher. Ms. Himes seconded. Motion approved by consensus. We have the following openings: Chorus, Science, ½ Business, Social Studies, and Math Intervention Specialist.

NEW BUSINESS

Teacher Election Results – The following teachers were elected to serve for the 2009-10 term: Shelly Hegyi, Ashley Himes, Melissa Conway, Carolyn Stewart, Joe Bertucci, and Barrett Bradshaw.

ADJOURN – Ms. Caldwell moved to adjourn, Mr. Styer seconded, and the motion was approved by consensus.
