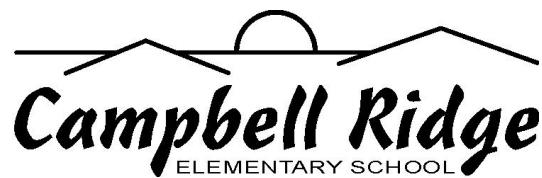

Winter 2021 MAP Results

- Winter to Winter growth was not good – there are a myriad of reasons given all that has occurred since last March. Lack of face-to-face instruction being the primary reason, inconsistent attendance and focus, and lack of time on task are also contributing factors.
- Areas of concern (fall to winter):
 - School conditional growth percentiles at grades 2-5 – all below 12%ile
 - Percent of students that met projected RIT – below 50% in grades 3-5, but above 40% so just below
 - Mean RIT percentile from fall to winter dropped in grades 2-5, so while the mean RIT at each grade did increase, the increase did not keep pace with the increase for all students (this is a number that I will point out to all because it shows that we can have growth but be losing ground)
